SECTION 2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION**Classification of the chemical**

Clear to slightly hazy, amber liquid. Characteristic fermentation & essential oils odor.

Most important hazards: May cause an allergic skin reaction. Occupational exposure to the substance or mixture may cause adverse effects.

SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

Description of first aid measures

SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for safe handling

- : Keep container tightly closed when not in use. Wear appropriate protective equipment. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. Do not ingest. Wash thoroughly after handling. Keep away from incompatibles. Keep away from extreme heat and flame. Empty containers retain residue and can be dangerous.
